As you know, the side door opening nearest to the Shrine of St. Charles of Mount Argus, has been designated a **Door of Mercy** throughout this Jubilee of Mercy; but I'm sure you would like to know where some of the other doors are, and you may even feel like making vour own pilgrimage during the Jubilee of Mercy to pass through each door. So just to let you know that there is one at St. Mary's Pro-Cathedral in Marlborough Street; Our Lady of Dolours' Church in Sean Mc Dermott Street, where Venerable Matt Talbot's remains lie; the Church of **St. Francis Xavier** in Gardiner Street, which holds the cross of Venerable John Sullivan: The Parish of Saints Peter and Mary in Arklow; and at the House of Mercy in Baggot Street, established in 1827 by Catherine McAuley, founders of the Sisters of Mercy. It is Pope Francis' desire that these doors become a "Door of Mercy through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons and instils hope."
