Saint Charles of Mount Argus

Last Thursday, 5 January, we celebrated the Feast of Saint Charles of Mount Argus, our own Saint who offered Mass, heard confessions and blessed the sick for many years in this Church. This year, 2017, we will celebrate the tenth anniversary of his canonisation. When Saint Charles was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI on 3 June 2007, he was hailed as "A New Saint for Ireland", since although he was born in the Netherlands, most of his life as a priest was spent in Ireland.

Here is an extract from a letter written by Saint Charles to his family:

"How necessary prayer is in order to practise all the virtues in their perfection. The lives of the saints show us that prayer was always their chief occupation. Yes, King David, a man burdened with the responsibilities of a great kingdom, tells us that it was prayer which inflamed his heart with such great love of God and heavenly things; we can admire this in his psalms. How greatly has God loved us! He did not spare his only Son but abandoned him to death, even death on the Cross. Jesus Christ urges us to pray; but how? Ask, seek and knock. It is for this reason that the Lord has said: 'Watch and pray; lest you fall into temptation'."

The book of Saint Charles's letters to his family is on sale at the reception desk in the monastery. The title is "Dear Brothers and Sisters".
