I write to inform you that Pope Francis has accepted that resignation. Bishop Field has been Auxiliary Bishop for the Archdiocese of Dublin since 1997 and has tirelessly guided the Pastoral Area assigned to him, as well as working in the area of health care. He has led the Diocesan celebrations of the World Day of the Sick for numerous years. At Episcopal Conference level, Bishop Field has undertaken many roles particularly in the areas of Justice and Peace, Health Care and Migration.
