Migrants and Refugees Day

Today in the Catholic Church we celebrate the World Day of Migrants and Refugees. Pope Francis has chosen the following phrase as this year's theme: "It is not just about migrants." Here is an extract from the Pope's letter for today:

"Migrants, refugees, displaced persons and victims of trafficking have become emblems of exclusion. In addition to the hardships that their condition entails, they are often looked down upon and considered the source of all society's ills. That attitude is an alarm bell warning of the moral decline we will face if we continue to give ground to the throw-away culture. In fact, if it continues, anyone who does not fall within the accepted norms of physical, mental and social well-being is at risk of marginalization and exclusion. For this reason, the presence of migrants and refugees – and of vulnerable people in general – is an invitation to recover some of those essential dimensions of our Christian existence and our humanity that risk being overlooked in a prosperous society. That is why it is not just about migrants."

Fr John Corrigan C.P. Please remember in your prayers Father John Corrigan CP of the Mount Argus community, who died during the week. Father John, who had been an altar server at Mount Argus, had been a Passionist for seventy years and a priest for sixty-four years. The earlier part of his life was spent teaching philosophy and theology to Passionist students, but most of his priestly ministry was in Botswana, Africa where he worked for forty-five years. As we pray for the happy repose of his soul, we pray also for his sisters, Annette and Mary and all family members that God may comfort them in their loss. May he rest in peace.
