### **Mission Sunday**

Today in Catholic Churches throughout the world we celebrate the World Day of Prayer for the Missions. The theme for this year's Mission Sunday is "Baptized and Sent: The Church of Christ on Mission in the World". In his message for today, Pope Francis writes: The Church is on mission in the world. Faith in Jesus Christ enables us to see all things in their proper perspective, as we view the world with God's own eyes and heart. Hope opens us up to the eternal horizons of the divine life that we share. Charity, of which we have a foretaste in the sacraments and in fraternal love, impels us to go forth to the ends of the earth.

A Message from An Garda Siochana: There has been an increase in Burglaries and Criminal Damage incidents in the general area of Mount Argus / Lower Kimmage Road / Harold's Cross Road and surrounding areas of late. An increase has occurred over the last five or six week period, which may reflect that people were away on holidays or, with the return to school, that family routines changed in households. Day time periods have been the most common time when these incidents occur. An Garda Siochana are appealing to parishioners to be extra vigilant when leaving their homes. Always check that the Alarm is set, all Windows are closed, rear Doors are locked and your home is fully secure before departing. Remember 'If you Love it, Lock up & Light up'. You are encouraged to keep an eye out for any unusual characters or vehicles in the area, and to contact Gardai if you have concerns. It is never a waste of time contacting Gardai if you observe anything unusual in the area where you live. You know your area and residents better than anyone else.
