Fr Dermot O'Carroll C.P.

Please remember in your prayers Father Dermot O'Carroll CP of the Mount Argus community, who died on Friday, aged 91. Father Dermot, who was from Ballyheigue, Co. Kerry, had been a Passionist for seventy-two years and a priest for sixty-six years. The earlier part of his life was spent teaching Irish to Passionist students, but most of his priestly ministry was in Botswana, Africa where he worked for many years. As we pray for the happy repose of his soul, we pray also for his brother, Brendan O'Carroll and all those to whom he ministered that God may comfort them in their loss.

Father Dermot's remains will be reposing in the Monastery Chapel from 6.30 on Monday evening. The removal to Mount Argus Church will be on Tuesday evening at 7.00, and the Funeral Mass will be on Wednesday morning at 11.30, followed by burial in the Passionist Community Cemetery at Mount Argus. May he rest in peace.

Mary Aikenhead Heritage Centre: Today (Sunday) is the birthday of Mother Mary Aikenhead who founded the Sisters of Charity and created Our Lady's Hospice, spending the last fifteen years of her life in Harold's Cross. Sister Rita from the Sisters of Charity will be speaking at the 6.15 Vigil Mass and the 11.00 Family Mass, inviting us to visit the Mary Aikenhead Heritage Centre, located in the grounds of Our Lady's Hospice. The Centre will be open today (Sunday, 19 January) from 2.00 to 5.00 pm. Why not visit the Centre and hear the story of a remarkable Irish woman who founded a hospital for the poor in Dublin, who visited women prisoners in Kilmainham Jail and who sent Sisters to Australia to minister to Irish women prisoners.
