# **Saint Charles of Mount Argus**

Today (Sunday, 5 January) is the anniversary of the death of St Charles of Mount Argus. Usually, this day is celebrated as the feast of St Charles but this year it is the Second Sunday of Christmas. Father Charles died at Mount Argus on this day in 1893, just two weeks after his seventy-first birthday. He had arrived at Mount Argus from England on 9 July 1857, having been born in the Netherlands and ordained as a Passionist priest in Belgium. During his years here, he was well known in Dublin and beyond for his compassion for the sick and suffering. Every day at Mount Argus he blessed the people with the relic of St Paul of the Cross, the founder of the Passionists, and many were healed through his intercession, as they still are today.

Saint Charles, you knew what it is like to live with sickness and pain.

We ask you to intercede for those who are sick.

May they know that, in their sickness,
the loving hand of God reaches out to them
with healing and hope for body and spirit.

May they learn to trust God and place
their lives in his hands. Amen.

<u>Eucharistic Adoration</u>: Our weekly Eucharistic Adoration in Mount Argus takes place on Wednesdays and Fridays from 10.30 am until 6.00 pm.

<u>Parish Envelopes 2020:</u> For those who make a contribution to the parish through the parish envelopes, new envelopes for 2020 are available for collection at the reception desk in the monastery. With the new charity regulations, we invite those who use the envelopes to keep the same number they had last year and to provide their name and address when collecting their envelopes. Those who prefer their envelope contribution to remain an anonymous donation are free to do so.

<u>Mount Argus Finances:</u> Thank you to all who support Mount Argus financially throughout the year. For your information, on the notice board at the back of the Church, there is a notice which gives a breakdown of how the finances are managed at Mount Argus.

<u>Saint Charles Blessings:</u> The Blessing with the relic of Saint Charles of Mount Argus is given on Sundays after the 11.00 am and 4.00 pm Masses. From Monday to Friday, the Blessing is given after 10.00 am Mass. On Wednesdays, Thursdays to Fridays the Blessing with the Relic of Saint Charles is also given at 4.00 pm. On Saturdays, the Blessing is given after the 11.00 am Saint Charles Novena Mass. At other times, the relic can be venerated at the Shrine and Tomb of Saint Charles.

<u>Monthly Healing Mass:</u> The monthly Healing Mass in honour of St Charles of Mount Argus is offered on the last Saturday of each month at 11.00 am. This is an opportunity to pray for healing for yourself through the intercession of St Charles or to pray for your loved ones who may be in need of God's healing grace. The blessing with the Relic of St Charles of Mount Argus is given at the Mass. After the Healing Mass, there is prayer ministry for those who would like someone to pray with them.

<u>Anam Cara</u>, the organisation that supports bereaved parents, are holding a Parent Support Event on 13 January at 7.20 pm in the Maldron Hotel, Whitestown Way, Tallaght. This event is free and open to all bereaved parents regardless of the age your child died, the circumstances of their death, or whether their death was recent or not.
