Triduum of Hope

This year's Triduum of Hope in honour of Mary, Mother of Hope and St Charles will take place from Monday, 25 May to Wednesday, 27 May. The morning session (with Mass) will be at 10.00 am and the evening session of Rosary, Homily and Eucharistic Benediction at 7.30 pm. During the Triduum, there will be the usual evening Mass at 6.15. The theme of this year's Triduum is "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted".

<u>**Tree of Hope:**</u> Next Sunday, during the 11.00 am Mass, there will be a Prayer of Remembrance in the Church for those we remember at the Tree of Hope opposite the Grotto.

Special Family Mass: Today (Sunday, 24 May) we will celebrate our monthly Special Family Mass with Children's readings and prayers of the faithful at 11.00 am. This Mass is for everyone, but especially those who are preparing for First Communion and Confirmation. The next Special Family Mass will be on Sunday, 14 June which is the Feast of Corpus Christi.

The Blessing with the Relic of St Charles of Mount Argus is given after the morning Masses on weekdays and after both Masses on Sundays.

The Rosary is prayed on the webcam after morning Mass on weekdays (Monday to Saturday).
