The Blessing with the Relic of St Charles of Mount Argus is given after the morning Masses on weekdays and after both Masses on Sundays.

The Rosary is prayed on the webcam after morning Mass on weekdays (Monday to Saturday).

Preparing to re-open Mount Argus Church

Last weekend I wrote about some of the preparations we need to make for reopening our church, initially for personal prayer and later for public Mass, and I invited anyone between the ages of 18 and 70, with no underlying health concerns, to contact the office to volunteer to help with cleaning and stewarding at Mount Argus. Fourteen people volunteered, and twelve of those were able to come along on Saturday afternoon to do an initial cleaning of the church. They have done a magnificent job and I thank them sincerely for that. On Tuesday, the Irish Bishops issued their "Framework Document for a return to the public celebration of Mass and the Sacraments". We also received some guidance from Archbishop Diarmuid Martin with the promise of more to follow. This means we now have a clearer idea of what is required to reopen the church and later begin public Masses.

The first thing that is clear is that we need more volunteers for cleaning and stewarding. When the church is open, even for personal prayer, benches and other surfaces will needed to be disinfected on a daily basis, and stewards will be needed. The safeguarding office has now said (during the week) that stewards and cleaners do not need to be vetted, but we will keep a register of names and contact details for those who are volunteering; this is important in case tracing and testing needs to be done if one of the volunteers discovers they have the virus.

The more stewards and cleaners we have, the less burden there will be on each one and the more service we will be able to provide. If you would like to help with cleaning the Church and/or with stewarding, please contact us either by email (office@mountargusparish.ie) or by phoning the office (01 499200). The office phone is attended from 9.30 am to 1.00 pm, Monday to Saturday. Outside of those times, you can leave a message and we will call you back.

For the time being, Mount Argus Church remains closed, but when we are able to open, we will let you know through the website, the Mount Argus Facebook page and by announcements on the livestream. Meanwhile, we will continue to livestream Mass every morning and evening. Initially we will reopen our Church for a few hours each day for private prayer; later we will begin having Mass for small groups of people and over time we will extend that. When, in the future, we do begin having the church open for Mass (which may be on 29 June but more probably will be later than that), the numbers attending will be very severely restricted. If we are going to practise social distancing in the church and not have people passing close by others to get in and out of benches, then that severely restricts the number of people who can be present at a Mass. In the next few weeks, we are going to have to look at how we make Mass available to as many people as possible either at weekends or on weekdays, but not just having the same people getting to Mass every day with others unable to be admitted to the church. We need a system by which everyone can have their turn at being present in the church for Mass, whether at the weekend or during the week. At the moment we are working on how that can be organised.

With the age profile of our congregation and of our priests and brothers, we have to continue to be cautious and to care for one another. Once more I am asking you to be patient in this difficult situation and to realise that it is important that people's lives are not put at risk and that we move forward as and when we feel safe and ready to do so.
