The Rosary is prayed on the webcam after morning Mass on weekdays (Monday to Saturday).

Re-opening Mount Argus Church

You are probably aware that on Friday, the Government announced that they would allow churches to open for public worship on 29 June, provided that social distancing is observed. The previous day, Archbishop Diarmuid Martin had written to tell us that the Irish Bishops will meet on Monday (tomorrow) and will issue clear guidelines for all dioceses. The Archbishop emphasised the importance of keeping to these guidelines; he wrote: "The advice that is given in other countries is: be ready by the date; if you are not fully ready, wait until you are ready; if it is not possible to apply the guidelines, remain closed. It may not be possible for all Churches to open and provide the supervision needed."

At this stage we do not know what the guidelines of the Irish Bishops are to be, but looking at what some dioceses in Ireland have already published and at what has been done in other countries such as Scotland where the Bishops published guidelines on Friday, we have an idea of the kind of preparations we need to make.

In order to open our Church, even for personal prayer, there are certain things we need to do. First, the Church needs to be cleaned as it has not been open to the public for three months. From other dioceses we see that good practice recommends the presence of volunteer stewards when the Church is open for personal prayer, at least in the initial weeks. We also will need volunteers to disinfect benches and other surfaces in the Church; this will have to be done on a daily basis. Volunteers will have to be at least eighteen years old and less than seventy years old with no underlying health issues; those volunteering as stewards will probably have to have been police vetted for the Archdiocese of Dublin during the last three years.

At this stage we need help to prepare for re-opening our Church for personal prayer. If you would like to help with the initial cleaning of the Church and/or with stewarding or cleaning when the Church is opened for personal prayer, please contact us either by email (office@mountargusparish.ie) or by phoning the office (01 499200). The office phone is attended from 9.30 am to 1.00 pm, Monday to Saturday. Outside of those times, you can leave a message and we will call you back.

For the time being, Mount Argus Church remains closed and we continue to livestream Mass every morning and evening. Initially we will reopen our Church for a few hours each day for private prayer (which will NOT happen this week); later we will begin having Mass for small groups of people and over time we will extend that. You might think that we are being more cautious than necessary, but the Coronavirus is still out there and, as yet, we have neither a vaccine nor a cure for it. With the age profile of our congregation and of our priests and brothers, caution is a good thing. Additionally, Mount Argus is a place of pilgrimage with people coming to us from many places; that also needs to be taken into account.

We are asking you to have patience in this difficult situation. What is important is that people's lives are not put at risk and that we go forward together as one family.
