Mount Argus Church Update – 19 July 2020

Masses are now at the usual times, except that there is no 9.00 am Mass on Saturday for the time being. We are continuing to livestream Mass every morning and evening as usual. Mass and confession times and opening hours for the church are on the Mount Argus website and are posted on the notice boards outside the church. There is no Eucharistic Adoration as yet.

On Wednesday, the Government announced that the number of people in an interior space remains at 50 until at least 10 August. They have said that churches can be divided into zones with 50 people in each zone provided that certain conditions can be met. We have now divided the church into two zones for Sunday Mass – we are calling them Zone A and Zone B. At present each zone will take up to 50 people.

Those going to Zone A will enter by the main door of the church; those going to Zone B will enter by the side door. You will not be able to move from one zone to another, which means that you might not be able to sit in your usual seat. You will have to remain in your zone before, during and after the Mass. Communion will be distributed inside your zone. Please take your time when leaving after Mass to allow people their own space.

When you enter and leave the church, we ask you to use the hand sanitisers and to observe the one-way system of movement which is marked on the floor. We strongly encourage those who wish to wear masks/face coverings. We regret that for the present, the toilets are not available to visitors.

We are still encouraging you to phone the office to book to attend Mass; if you book, you are sure of getting in to the church for Mass. If you are able to come to your weekly Mass on a weekday and not on a Sunday, this will help those who are only free to come to Mass at the weekend. Nobody is obliged to come out to church for Mass at present.

We still need more volunteers for cleaning and stewarding. Some of the volunteers were here three or four times in the past week; this is not sustainable in the long term. If you are between the ages of 18 and 70, with no underlying health concerns, and are able to help with cleaning and stewarding at Mount Argus, even for one hour per week, please contact us either by email (office@mountargusparish.ie) or by phoning the office (01 4992000).

Easing of Government restrictions has been put on hold this week, so we all need to continue to take the necessary precautions with social distancing, hand washing, limiting our contacts, and so on. The pandemic is not over. The virus has not gone away. We do not want people's lives to be put at risk in church. So let's continue to be cautious, to have patience and to pray for one another and support one another.
