**October Rosary:** Pope Francis has encouraged us to pray the Rosary during the month of October. At Mount Argus we are livestreaming Rosary and Benediction every Wednesday during October at 7.30 pm. Last Wednesday, at the Papal Audience on the Feast of Our Lady of the Rosary, Pope Francis spoke about the importance of prayer in our life as Christians. He also spoke about the beauty of praying the Rosary. Here are some extracts from his address:

Today, in this time of the pandemic, we need to hold the rosary in our hands and pray for ourselves, our loved ones and all people.

The rosary is the most beautiful prayer that we can offer to the Virgin Mary. It is a contemplation of the stages of the life of Jesus the Saviour with his Mother Mary and it is a weapon that protects us from evil and temptation.

In the Rosary, when we meditate on the mysteries of salvation, the loving face of God Himself, whom we are called to contemplate in eternity, is revealed to us more and more.

I invite you to take the rosary in your hand every day and to raise your eyes to Mary our Mother, who is a sign of consolation and sure hope.

I invite everyone, especially during this month of October, to rediscover the beauty of the Rosary which has nourished the faith of the Christian people across the centuries.

May Mary our Mother be a sure guide for us on our journey towards the Lord.

World Mission Sunday: Next weekend we celebrate the World Day of Prayer for the Missions.

#### Mount Argus Church Update - 11 October 2020

All of Ireland is now at Level 3 of the Government's Plan for Living with COVID-19. This will continue until 27 October. During this time, Masses at Mount Argus will be available online only, and the Church will be open only for personal prayer. We will continue to have all the usual Masses at the usual times, available on our webcam page at www.churchservices.tv/mountargus

Times of Masses at Mount Argus are as follows:

Saturday Vigil 6.15 pm; Sunday 8.00 am, 11.00 am and 4.00 pm; Monday to Friday 10.00 am and 6.15 pm; Saturday morning at 11.00 (with St Charles Novena Prayers).

The Rosary is prayed after morning Mass on weekdays (Monday to Saturday), except on Fridays when we have Stations of the Cross after morning Mass.

The Church will be open for personal prayer at these hours:

Saturday- 12.00 noon to 5.00 pm; Sunday – 12.00 noon to 3.00 pm; Monday to Friday – 11.00 am to 5.00 pm There will be no Confessions and no Eucharistic Adoration at Mount Argus during this time.

Meanwhile, let's continue to pray for one another and to remember especially those who are sick and those who are caring for the sick.
