Eucharistic Adoration: This time of silent prayer and adoration takes place at the High Altar on Wednesdays and Fridays from 4.00 to 6.00 pm.

Times of Prayer: The Rosary is prayed after morning Mass on weekdays (Monday to Saturday), except on Fridays when we pray the Stations of the Cross. The Blessing with the Relic of St Charles is given after morning Mass on weekdays and after the 11.00 am and 4.00 pm Masses on Sundays. There is also a Blessing with the Relic of St Charles on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday at 4.00 pm.

Mount Argus Church Update – Christmas Masses 2020

Masses at Christmas have the same restriction on numbers as Mass on other days. Here at Mount Argus we will have two zones at the evening Masses on Christmas Eve and the Masses on Christmas Day, St Stephen's Day (Saturday, 26 December) and Sunday, 27 December. This will give us a total of 100 people for Mass on these days. We will have extra Masses at Christmas, but we encourage you to think of going to Mass for Christmas on another day during the twelve days of Christmas, until the Feast of the Epiphany on 6 January.

On the evening of Christmas Eve, Masses will be at 4.00, 6.00, 8.00 and 10.00 pm.

On Christmas Day, Masses will be at 8.00 and 11.00 am.

Admission to the Christmas Eve and Christmas Day Masses will be by ticket only. You can book a ticket by phoning the office at Mount Argus (01 4992000), beginning on Monday at 9.30 am. We will take your name and phone number, and arrange for you to receive your tickets between now and Christmas.

You can book for your household, but please only book for people who will be there at the Mass, not for those you think might possibly like to be there. Please think of other people also at this time. We will not be taking bookings for you and your twenty-four grandchildren who always come to Mount Argus with you on Christmas Day. This year, things are different, so think of other people, not just of your own family.

And, for Mass attendance, think of Christmas as a season, not just a day. If you can come for your Christmas Mass on another day during the Christmas season, that will be helpful to everyone. There is, of course, no obligation to be in church for Mass at Christmas. All our Masses will be streamed on the Mount Argus webcam, and you can choose to take part in the Mass in that way.
