Preparing for Advent and Christmas

The Feast of Christ the King, which we celebrate today, is the last Sunday in the Church's liturgical year. Next Sunday a new Church year begins with the First Sunday of Advent. We can think this week about how we are going to celebrate Advent which is a time of preparation for the coming of Christ at Christmas and his Second Coming at the end of time. Can we make a welcoming space for Jesus in our homes and in our lives?

Music at Mass: Since the pandemic began, we have not been permitted to have congregational singing in church. During the past months, we have simply had the organ playing with no one singing at Mass. Next Sunday, we will be reintroducing a cantor at those Sunday Masses which normally have music. Unfortunately we are still not able to have congregational singing so, instead of encouraging people to sing in church, we still have to ask you not to sing when you come to church. We hope this will change in the coming months, and this is why we have reintroduced cantors to prepare us for what will be a welcome change.

Our Synodal Journey: In the coming weeks and months, together with the whole Church, we will be entering into a time of reflection and sharing on the mission of the Church today as we take part in the journey “For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission”. All this we ask of You who are at work in every place and time
In the communion of the Father and Son, forever and ever.*

Mount Argus Church Update – 21 November 2021

When coming to Mass at Mount Argus, we ask you to wear a face mask, to use the hand sanitisers inside the church and to practise social distancing. The one-way system of movement is marked on the floor. We continue to livestream Mass every morning and evening as usual. The Bishops have said that the obligation to attend Sunday Mass is still suspended.

The church opens at 9.30 am from Monday to Friday and remains open until after the evening Mass. On Saturday the church opens at 10.30 am until after the evening Mass. On Sunday, the church opens at 7.30 am but closes after the 8.00 am Mass and re-opens at 10.30 am. This allows us to clean and prepare the church for Mass. The church remains open after the 11.00 am Mass on Sunday and closes after 4.00 pm Mass. We still need volunteers for cleaning and stewarding. If you are between the ages of 18 and 70, with no underlying health concerns, and are able to help with cleaning and stewarding at Mount Argus, even for one hour per week, please contact us either by email (office@mountargusparish.ie) or by phoning the office (01 4992000).
