The Synodal Pathway at Mount Argus

Pope Francis has asked every baptized person to think about how the Church might fulfil the mandate of Jesus to "go out to the whole world and proclaim the Good News." With this in mind, he has invited us all to take part in the "Synodal Pathway". The Bishops of Ireland explain the Synodal Pathway in these words: "It means walking together on our pilgrim way in faith towards God, conscious of our God- given gifts. Essentially, it is listening intently to each other. We are then called to engage in reflecting and praying together about what we are hearing. We journey in this way to allow the Holy Spirit to guide us in our mission of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ in Ireland and beyond."

To accompany us on this journey, two of our parish community, Maria Diskin and Derbhil Johnson, have trained with the Dublin Diocese as "animators" to help us listen to each other and then reflect and pray about what we have heard. Derbhil and Maria will be speaking to us at Mass on the weekend of 26-27 March, and inviting us to take part in a conversation to begin our journey along the Synodal Pathway.

<u>Collection for Ukraine:</u> This weekend we will have a collection after Mass to support the refugee work of the Passionists in Ukraine and Poland. This collection will be taken up outside the church.

<u>St Patrick's Holidays:</u> Thursday of this week is St Patrick's Day. There will be Vigil Mass on Wednesday at 6.15 pm. Mass on St Patrick's Day will be at 11.00 am only. This year, Friday, 18 March is also a public holiday. Mass on Friday at Mount Argus will be at 11.00 am only. There will be no evening Mass, no Confessions and no Eucharistic Adoration on 17 and 18 March. The church will close at 5.00 pm on both Thursday 17th and Friday 18th March.

Mount Argus Bulletin: There will be no newsletter next weekend because of the St Patrick's holidays. **Parish Council Report:** The Parish Council met on Wednesday, 9 March. This was the Council's first 'in person' meeting for two years. Among topics discussed were developing parish life after the pandemic, reopening the Mount Argus Community Centre, and planning our parish's participation in the Synodal Pathway.

Trocaire Lenten Boxes: Lenten Boxes for Trocaire are available on the tables at the back of the Church. Saint Charles Jubilee Year: To mark the two hundredth anniversary of the birth of Saint Charles of Mount Argus, Pope Francis has granted a Jubilee Year to the birthplace of Saint Charles in the Netherlands and to our church at Mount Argus. During the Jubilee Year, which lasts from 11 December 2021 to 5 January 2023, a Plenary Indulgence can be gained by those who visit Mount Argus Church. The Jubilee Indulgence for the St Charles Jubilee Year can be received every day at Mount Argus during the Jubilee Year by fulfilling these two conditions: (1) making a Pilgrim Visit to Mount Argus Church to take part in a Jubilee celebration or to pray at the tomb of St Charles, saying there the Our Father, the Creed and a prayer to Our Blessed Lady and to St Charles; (2) Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and Prayer for the Pope's intentions. The elderly, the sick and all those who, for grave reason, cannot leave their homes, will be able to obtain the plenary indulgence by repenting of all sins, and by intending to fulfil the conditions of confession, communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions as soon as possible, if in the presence of an image of Saint Charles, they have spiritually participated in the Jubilee, offering to the merciful Lord their prayers and sufferings and the hardships of their lives.
