Triduum of Hope

This year's Triduum of Hope in honour of Mary, Mother of Hope and St Charles will take place from Monday, 30 May to Wednesday, 1 June at 10.00 am and 7.30 pm. The Triduum takes place during our Jubilee Year for the bicentenary of the birth of Saint Charles. The theme of this year's Triduum is the theme of the Jubilee Year "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest". Petitions for the Triduum can be placed in the basket at the back of the church or handed in at the monastery. Petition forms and offering envelopes are on the tables at the back of the church. Parish Council: The Parish Pastoral Council met last Monday. We discussed the results of our parish Synod gathering which have now been forwarded to the Synod Group for the Archdiocese. We also looked at the "Building Hope" process of discernment for renewal in the Archdiocese. We hope to have a parish gathering in June when we can reflect together on pastoral renewal at our own local level and cooperation with others.

Collection Basket: For those at Mass in church, a collection basket is available at the back of the church. Saint Charles Jubilee Year: To mark the two hundredth anniversary of the birth of Saint Charles of Mount Argus, Pope Francis has granted a Jubilee Year to the birthplace of Saint Charles in the Netherlands and to our church at Mount Argus. During the Jubilee Year, which lasts from 11 December 2021 to 5 January 2023, a Plenary Indulgence can be gained by those who visit Mount Argus Church. The Jubilee Indulgence for the St Charles Jubilee Year can be received every day at Mount Argus during the Jubilee Year by fulfilling these two conditions: (1) making a Pilgrim Visit to Mount Argus Church to take part in a Jubilee celebration or to pray at the tomb of St Charles, saying there the Our Father, the Creed and a prayer to Our Blessed Lady and to St Charles; (2) Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and Prayer for the Pope's intentions. The elderly, the sick and all those who, for grave reason, cannot leave their homes, will be able to obtain the plenary indulgence by repenting of all sins, and by intending to fulfil the conditions of confession, communion and prayer for the Pope's intentions as soon as possible, if in the presence of an image of Saint Charles, they have spiritually participated in the Jubilee, offering to the merciful Lord their prayers and sufferings and the hardships of their lives.
