Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on Wednesday, 18 January, and continues until Wednesday, 25 January which is the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. The theme for the 2023 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is 'BeLonging: Praying for Unity amidst Injustice.' This theme has been prepared by the churches of Minneapolis, as a way to explore how the work of Christian unity can contribute to the promotion of racial justice across all levels of society. The work of restoring hope through justice continues to inspire and change lives for the better. As we join with other Christians around the world for the Week of Prayer we pray that our hearts will be open to see and hear the many ways in which racism continues to destroy lives, and to discern the steps we can take as individuals and communities to heal the hurts and build a better future for everyone.

The Inaugural Service for the 2023 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity will be held in Christchurch Cathedral on Wednesday, 18 January at 8.00 pm. The service will be led by members of the Dublin Council of Churches. All are Welcome.
