Baptism for Mission

"In virtue of their baptism, all the members of the People of God have become missionary disciples (cf. Mt 28:19). All the baptized, whatever their position in the Church or their level of instruction in the faith, are agents of evangelization, and it would be insufficient to envisage a plan of evangelization to be carried out by professionals while the rest of the faithful would simply be passive recipients. The new evangelization calls for personal involvement on the part of each of the baptized. Every Christian is challenged, here and now, to be actively engaged in evangelization; indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love. Every Christian is a missionary to the extent that he or she has encountered the love of God in Christ Jesus: we no longer say that we are "disciples" and "missionaries", but rather that we are always "missionary disciples". If we are not convinced, let us look at those first disciples, who, immediately after encountering the gaze of Jesus, went forth to proclaim him joyfully: "We have found the Messiah!" (John 1:41).... So what are we waiting for?"

Mass of Thanksgiving for the St Charles Jubilee Year: At the 4.00 pm Mass today (Sunday) we will offer prayers in thanksgiving for the grace of the St Charles Jubilee Year. To mark the two hundredth anniversary of the birth of St Charles, Pope Francis granted to Mount Argus and to the birthplace of St Charles at the Netherlands a special Holy Year which concluded last Thursday on the Feast of St Charles. This Mass is an opportunity to thank God for the Jubilee and to pray for healing through the intercession of St Charles. <u>Mass for Pope Benedict XVI</u>: On Saturday, 14 January at the 11.00 am Novena Mass, we will celebrate a Mass for the repose of the soul of the late Pope Benedict XVI and in thanksgiving for his vocation as successor of St Peter. It was Pope Benedict who canonised St Charles of Mount Argus in 2007. Here is an extract from the homily Pope Benedict preached on that occasion:

"The love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us" (Romans 5:5). Truly, in the case of the Passionist priest, Charles of Saint Andrew Houben, we see how that love overflowed in a life totally dedicated to the care of souls. During his many years of priestly ministry in England and Ireland, the people flocked to him to seek out his wise counsel, his compassionate care and his healing touch. In the sick and the suffering he recognized the face of the Crucified Christ, to whom he had a lifelong devotion. He drank deeply from the rivers of living water that poured forth from the side of the Pierced One, and in the power of the Spirit he bore witness before the world to the Father's love. At the funeral of this much-loved priest, affectionately known as Fr Charles of Mount Argus, his superior was moved to observe: "The people have already declared him a saint".

<u>Pilgrims' Praver:</u> Here is a prayer written by Pope Benedict which reminds us that our life is a pilgrimage.

Lord Jesus Christ, pilgrim of Emmaus, you make yourself close to us for love, even if, at times, discouragement and sadness prevent us from discovering your presence. You are the flame that revives our faith. You are the light that purifies our hope. You are the force that stirs our charity. Teach us to recognize you in the Word, in the house and on the Table where the Bread of Life is shared, in generous service to our suffering neighbour. And when evening falls, Lord, help us to say: "Stay with us". Amen.

Building Hope through Parish Partnership: As part of the *Building Hope* process, Archbishop Dermot Farrell recently announced the new parish partnerships. Mount Argus Parish has been partnered with Harold's Cross, Rathmines, Rathgar and Beechwood Avenue parishes. We will be looking together at future ways of cooperating with these parishes. In a recent interview with 'The Tablet', Archbishop Farrell said that the partnerships are about creating 'a framework in which we can share an exciting vision of how priests and people together in the archdiocese can respond to and draw strength for the call we each received in Baptism'. **What do we believe about death?** You are invited to a short talk and discussion on 'Is Death a New Beginning?' on Tuesday, 10 January at 7.00 pm in the Legion of Mary house at 60 Sundrive Road.
