### **World Day for the Care of Creation**

Since 2015, the Catholic Church celebrates 1st September as the World Day for the Care of Creation. The day is inspired by Pope Francis' landmark encyclical *Laudato Si'*, which calls on 'every person living on this planet' to care for our shared Earth. Pope Francis explains the meaning of the day in these words: 'The annual World Day of prayer for the Care of Creation offers to individual believers and to the community a precious opportunity to reaffirm our personal vocation to be stewards of creation, to thank God for the wonderful handiwork which he has entrusted to our care, and to implore his help for the protection of creation, as well as his pardon for the sins committed against the world in which we live.' In recent months some members of the Parish Pastoral Council have been looking at a document called 'Faith-Communities – Actions to help pollinators'. This initiative encourages parish communities to take actions to help save our bees by managing our landscape 'to better support and enhance all nature and creation'. There are said to be ninety-nine different species of bees in Ireland, one third of which are threatened with extinction. The booklet's guidelines suggest twenty-four practical actions which are the measures that are most likely to benefit Irish pollinators; these include: mowing areas of grass using a pollinator-friendly regime; installing a bee hotel; raising awareness in the community; organising a parish action day; planting pollinator friendly bulbs, trees, shrubs and flower beds and reducing the use of pesticides.
