On Wednesday, 30 September at 7.30 pm we will have a Celebration of God's Healing Mercy. This time of prayer will be available on the webcam, as public worship is not permitted in Dublin at the moment. It will include prayer and meditation, with Eucharistic Adoration and Benediction, reflecting on this year's pastoral theme at the Shrine of St Charles of Mount Argus: "The Lord is close to the broken hearted". We hope you will pray with us for all those whose lives have been affected by the Coronavirus Pandemic, asking the Lord for safety and healing for those we love and for all those who need our prayers.

### MOUNT ARGUS PARISH MISSION STATEMENT

Our mission is to be a living parish where all will feel welcome, everyone will be appreciated and encouraged to use their gifts and people and priests work together to develop a community of faith and compassion.

Safegarding Sunday: Today is Safeguarding Sunday. This is from Archbishop Martin's message for today: Sunday 27 September is Diocesan Safeguarding Day. As your Archbishop, I have made the safety and protection from abuse of the children and vulnerable members of Archdiocese a particular priority. It has been a challenge to all of us to face up to our responsibility to make reparation for the failures of the past. This year we face a different set of challenges and we do so in a situation of considerable uncertainty. Given our uncertain financial future, we will have to learn to use our declining resources sparingly and wisely. You will be aware that it has been necessary to reduce the number employed by the Diocese including a number of people employed in the Child Safeguarding and Protection Service. However, our commitment to safeguarding and to support of victim/ survivors of abuse remains undiminished. We need to consider the implications of working with less and the opportunities this presents to look at how we share what we have.

<u>Times of Prayer on the Webcam:</u> The Rosary is prayed after morning Mass on weekdays (Monday to Saturday), except on Fridays when we pray the Stations of the Cross. The Blessing with the Relic of St Charles is given after morning Mass on weekdays and after the 11.00 am and 4.00 pm Masses on Sundays.

Day for Life: Next Sunday the Catholic Church in Ireland celebrates the annual Day for Life.

<u>Crosscare Collection:</u> As there are no public Masses at present, there are Crosscare envelopes at the back of the church so that, if you are visiting the church during the week, you can take an envelope to make a donation either by posting it to Crosscare or by leaving it with one of the priests for forwarding to Crosscare.

Saturday morning at 11.00 (with St Charles Novena Prayers).

The Rosary is prayed after morning Mass on weekdays (Monday to Saturday), except on Fridays when we have Stations of the Cross after morning Mass.

The Church will be open for personal prayer at these hours:

Saturday- 12.00 noon to 5.00 pm

Sunday – 12.00 noon to 3.00 pm

Monday to Friday – 11.00 am to 5.00 pm

There will be no Confessions and no Eucharistic Adoration at Mount Argus during this time.

Meanwhile, let's continue to pray for one another and to remember especially those who are sick and those who are caring for the sick.
