October – The Month of the Holy Rosary

‘The Rosary is my favourite prayer. A marvellous prayer! Marvellous in its simplicity and its depth. It can be said that the Rosary is, in some sense, a prayer-commentary on the final chapter of the Vatican II Constitution *Lumen Gentium*, a chapter which discusses the wondrous presence of the Mother of God in the mystery of Christ and the Church. Against the background of the words *Ave Maria* the principal events of the life of Jesus Christ pass before the eyes of the soul. They take shape in the complete series of the joyful, sorrowful and glorious mysteries, and they put us in living communion with Jesus through – we might say – the heart of his Mother. At the same time our heart can embrace in the decades of the Rosary all the events that make up the lives of individuals, families, nations, the Church, and all mankind. Our personal concerns and those of our neighbour, especially those who are closest to us, who are dearest to us. Thus the simple prayer of the Rosary marks the rhythm of human life.’

Parish Council: The Parish Pastoral Council met last Wednesday, 5 October. Among topics discussed were two new documents from the Dublin Diocese: the response to the Building Hope meetings and a new policy for Accompanying Families for First Communion and Confirmation; both of these are available on the diocesan website (www.dublindiocese.ie). The parish council also looked at reinstating the monthly Family Mass on Sundays at 11.00 am and the monthly coffee morning after Mass. The volunteers evening, which before the pandemic was usually held in October, will be postponed until the springtime.

Sisters of St Peter Claver: The collection last weekend for the work of the Missionary Sisters of St Peter Claver came to €3,424. In a letter of thanks, the Sisters wrote: ‘Please convey our heartfelt thanks to one and all for their wonderful support to the missions, to the neediest, who will profit greatly from these donations. May the Lord bless you in return. May all of you rest assured of our grateful prayers, as every month in each of our communities around the world Holy Mass is offered for the deceased and the living Friends and Benefactors of our Congregation.’

Saint Charles Jubilee Year: To mark the two hundredth anniversary of the birth of Saint Charles of Mount Argus, Pope Francis has granted a Jubilee Year to the birthplace of Saint Charles in the Netherlands and to our church at Mount Argus. The theme of the Jubilee Year is “Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest” (Matthew 11: 28). The Jubilee is an invitation from the Lord to let ourselves be touched by his mercy and to experience the loving presence of Jesus Christ who came to heal the broken-hearted. It is a time of grace and forgiveness, a time of renewal in our Christian life.

During the Jubilee Year, which lasts from 11 December 2021 to 5 January 2023, a Plenary Indulgence can be gained by those who visit Mount Argus Church. The Jubilee Indulgence for the St Charles Jubilee Year can be received every day at Mount Argus during the Jubilee Year by fulfilling these two conditions: (1) making a Pilgrim Visit to Mount Argus Church to take part in a Jubilee celebration or to pray at the tomb of St Charles, saying there the Our Father, the Creed and a prayer to Our Blessed Lady and to St Charles; (2) Sacramental Confession, Eucharistic Communion and Prayer for the Pope’s intentions. The elderly, the sick and all those who, for grave reason, cannot leave their homes, can obtain the plenary indulgence by repenting of all sins, and by intending to fulfil the conditions of confession, communion and prayer for the Pope’s intentions as soon as possible, if in the presence of an image of Saint Charles, they have spiritually participated in the Jubilee, offering to the merciful Lord their prayers and sufferings and the hardships of their lives.
