#### Parish Assembly 2023

Would you like to make new friends, learn more about what happens at Mount Argus, and get involved in the life of our faith community? On Wednesday, 10 May at 7.30 pm in the Upper Room we will have our Parish Assembly, a general meeting of our parish community. This is our first Parish Assembly since 2019. It is an opportunity for us to come together to look at what we would like to develop in the future as a faith community, responding to Archbishop Farrell's "Building Hope" initiative and the challenges and opportunities for the new parish partnerships. At the meeting we will review last year's Synodal and Building Hope gatherings and hear from Patricia Carroll (Director of Mission and Ministry, Archdiocese of Dublin) about the "Building Hope" process and how it will affect Mount Argus. We will also look at how we might continue to renew and rebuild parish life after the restrictions and limitations of recent years. The meeting is open to all those who regularly pray and worship in Mount Argus.

<u>Lay Ministry Collection:</u> The Archdiocese of Dublin Lay Ministry Collection takes place today. This collection will be taken up outside the church. The Lay Ministry Collection will support the development of a variety of lay ministries, providing for more women and men to work alongside the priests and deacons. The Archdiocese hopes that lay ministry will make a significant contribution to pastoral life into the future.
