Diocesan Certificate in Catechesis: Starting this September the Office of Mission and Ministry will be offering a Diocesan Certificate in Catechesis. This is a modular course over seven Saturdays in St Paul's, Arran Quay. Part One of the course explores Foundations in Catechesis with four modules: Module One: The Vocation of the Catechist – Called to Share Faith; Module Two: Catechesis and the RCIA; Module Three: Catechesis, Method and Content; Module Four: Catechesis, Prayer and Liturgy. Part Two of the course explores Catechesis in Practice with three modules: Module Five: Accompanying Families for Baptism; Module Six: Accompanying Families for Holy Communion; Module Seven: Accompanying Families for Confirmation. On completion of the course participants will receive the Diocesan Certificate in Catechesis. Assessment will be done through journaling. Applications are now open for the next intake of participants for Pathways. The programme, run by the Dublin Archdiocese, begins this year in DCU St Patrick's Campus, Upper Drumcondra Road, Dublin 9, on Thursday, 28 September (7.00 - 9.30 pm). Places are limited so early application is advised. Pathways is a two-year, one-evening-a-week course for adults of all ages who wish to explore their faith.
