Canonisation Anniversary

This weekend we celebrate the sixteenth anniversary of the Canonisation of St Charles of Mount Argus. Father Charles was declared a saint by Pope Benedict XVI on Sunday, 3 June 2007. It was a very wet day both in Dublin and in Rome but the weather didn't dampen the spirits of those who took part in the Canonisation Masses in St Peter's Square and at Mount Argus. Here are some words from Pope Benedict's homily at the canonisation of Father Charles:

"The love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us". Truly, in the case of the Passionist priest, Saint Charles of Mount Argus, we see how that love overflowed in a life totally dedicated to the care of souls. During his many years of priestly ministry in Ireland and England, the people flocked to him to seek out his wise counsel, his compassionate care and his healing touch. In the sick and the suffering he recognized the face of the Crucified Christ, to whom he had a lifelong devotion. He drank deeply from the rivers of living water that poured forth from the side of the Pierced One, and in the power of the Spirit he bore witness before the world to the Father's love. <u>Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus:</u> Friday, 16 June is the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In 1873, one hundred and fifty years ago this year, the Bishops of Ireland consecrated Ireland to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, entrusting this land and its people to the loving heart of Christ. To mark this anniversary, there will be a special Mass at 7.30 pm on Friday, 16 June.
