<u>Masses for Christmas</u>: Today (Sunday 24 December, Christmas Eve), there will be the usual Sunday Masses: The Masses for Christmas will be as follows: on Christmas Eve, there will be the Vigil Mass of Christmas at 6.15 pm, and the Mass of the Nativity at 9.00 pm, with Carols from 8.30 pm and the Blessing of the Crib before the Mass. On Christmas Day, the Dawn Mass will be at 8.00 am and the Day Mass (Family Mass) will be celebrated at 11.00 am. **Please note that there will be no evening Mass on Christmas Day**.

30 December (Saturday): 11.00 am, 6.15 pm (Vigil)
31 December (Sunday): 8.00 am, 11.00 am, 4.00 pm 1 January (New Year's Day): 11.00 am Normal Mass times will resume on 2 January.

<u>**Confession Times:**</u> There will be no confessions in the church on Sunday, 24 December. After that, there will be no confessions in the church until Wednesday, 3 January when normal confession times will resume.

Feast of Saint Charles of Mount Argus: We will celebrate the Feast of Saint Charles on Friday, 5 January with Mass at 10.00 am. In preparation for the Feast, there will be a "Transitus" Vigil of Prayer at the Tomb of Saint Charles on Thursday evening, 4 January, at 7.30. The Vigil will include Readings about the life and death of Saint Charles, a candle-lighting ceremony at the Tomb, Hymns and Prayers for Healing. We are very blessed at Mount Argus to have our own saint, Saint Charles, who celebrated Mass, heard confessions and blessed the sick in this church, and who intercedes for those who need healing and hope today.
