Week of Prayer for Christian Unity

The annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on Thursday, 18 January, and continues until Thursday, 25 January which is the Feast of the Conversion of Saint Paul. The theme for the 2024 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is 'You shall love the Lord your God... and your neighbour as yourself' (Lk 10: 27). This theme has been prepared by the Catholic and Protestant Churches of Burkina Faso as they reflect on what it means to love one's neighbour in the midst of a security crisis. Archbishop Farrell writes to us: "The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is a privileged moment of prayer, encounter and dialogue. It is an opportunity to recognise and receive the richness and value that are present in the other, the different and to ask God for the gift of unity."

The Inaugural Service for the 2024 Week of Prayer for Christian Unity will be held in Our Lady Mother of the Church, Castleknock on Thursday, 18 January at 8.00 pm. All are Welcome.
