Golden Jubilee Summer Picnic

Today (Sunday) at 11.00 am, we have our last Special Family Mass before the summer holidays. This Mass is for everyone, but especially those who have received First Communion and Confirmation this year. After the Mass, the Parish Pastoral Council invites you to our Golden Jubilee Summer Picnic in the grounds of Mount Argus, weather permitting (otherwise indoors).

June – The Month of the Sacred Heart: Last Wednesday, Pope Francis announced that he is preparing a new document on devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. He said:

We are passing through this month dedicated to the Sacred Heart. 27 December of last year marked the 350th anniversary of the first manifestation of the Sacred Heart of Jesus to St Margaret Mary Alacoque. That occasion marked the beginning of a period of celebrations that will end on 27 June next year. This is why I am pleased to prepare a document that brings together the precious reflections of previous Magisterial texts and a long history that goes back to the Sacred Scriptures, in order to re-propose today, to the whole Church, this devotion imbued with spiritual beauty. I believe it will do us great good to meditate on various aspects of the Lord's love, which can illuminate the path of ecclesial renewal; but also says something meaningful to a world that seems to have lost its heart. I ask you to accompany me in prayer, during this time of preparation, with the intention of making this document public next September.

Pilgrim Walk to the Well: The annual prayer service at St Colmcille's Well, at the top of the Ballycullen Road, will be held on Sunday, 9 June, at 3.00 pm.
