Third Sunday of Advent – Gaudete Sunday (year A)

On this the third Sunday of Advent, the theme is traditionally one of joy. The first word of the entrance antiphon today is "Rejoice!" – gaudete in Latin. This Sunday, therefore, has come to be known as "Gaudete Sunday".

In the past, Advent was a penitential season - many may still remember when there was fasting during this period - and the celebrant of the liturgy wears vestments with the penitential colour of purple or violet. The atmosphere was deliberately sombre and penitential.

In the middle of it all, people needed to be reminded of what they were preparing for - the very joyful occasion of the birth of Jesus. In the midst of all the penance and fasting, today was conceived as a window of joy and brightness in anticipation of what was to come. To mark this, in many churches the priests wears a pinkish red, a toned-down violet usually described as "rose".

The readings today, Gaudete Sunday, are full of encouragement, resonating with joyful hope as we draw closer to the celebration of the birthday of Jesus, the coming of God's Son to live amongst us. As we continue our preparation for Christmas, we also rejoice that Jesus has already come.

Advent Carol Service

In Italy, today is known as "Bambinelli Sunday" when the little figures of the baby Jesus, which people will place in their Christmas Cribs, are brought to the church to be blessed. We invite children – and adults too – to bring the baby Jesus figure from their Crib to the Advent Carol Service at 6pm this Sunday evening, when there will be a special blessing for the figures of the Christ-child (the "Bambinelli").
