Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings invite us to follow a lifestyle focused on humility, righteousness, integrity and mercy, challenging the worldly ways of success and happiness. They encourage us to trust in God's protection and the promise of reward in heaven

In the first reading, Zephaniah urges people to be humble and do what is right; to be people of integrity and humility. The Lord will protect those living honest and just lives. The Psalmist celebrates the Lord's faithfulness and concern for the poor and oppressed. God acts by giving food, freedom, sight, and hope, bringing justice and lifting up those bowed down.

In the Gospel, Jesus teaches the Beatitudes, revealing a portrait of his own core attitudes and values. He expects his disciples to have these same qualities, which lay out the way to follow him.

St Brigid, Patroness of Ireland

St Brigid, born in Faughart, Co. Louth in 450AD, is known as one of Ireland's three patron saints. She is celebrated for her compassion, leadership, and miracles, her feast day being 1st February, marking the start of spring. She is associated with healing, poetry, learning, blacksmithing, livestock, and dairy, and is famous for founding monasteries, keeping a perpetual flame at Kildare, and the tradition of weaving rush crosses for protection.

Traditionally, people make the crosses out of reeds/rushes, which they place inside the house, above a door or window, to welcome the spring season and her feast day. People believe it protects the home from evil, fire, and hunger.

The story behind St Brigid's Cross is that Brigid was asked to comfort a dying pagan chieftain, possibly her father. When she arrived at the sick man's house, he was raving, thought to be beyond consoling and saving. St Brigid calmed him down and began weaving a cross for him from rushes she found on the floor. Watching her work, he asked what she was doing and she explained the story of the Christian cross and the story of salvation to him. Through her story, he became a Christian and asked to be baptised before he died.

St Brigid died at the age of 75 in 525AD and was buried in the church she founded. Her remains were later exhumed and brought to Downpatrick to be buried alongside Saints Patrick and Columcille. Her skull, however was brought to Lisbon where it remains today.

Monday is a Bank Holiday. There will be only **one Mass at 11:00am**, and the parish office/Monastery reception will be closed.

Candlemas and St Blaise

On **Monday, 2nd February** we celebrate Candlemas Day, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. Candles will be blessed at the **11.00am Mass**. If you wish to have candles blessed, please bring them to Mass on the day.

In 1997, Pope Saint John Paul II instituted the Feast of the Presentation as a special day of prayer for women and men in consecrated life – sisters, brothers and priests who are members of Religious Orders and Congregations. Pray in the words of Pope Francis:

“Today we celebrate the feast of the encounter: may the Virgin Mary obtain for us the grace that the lives of consecrated persons will always be a feast of the encounter with Christ; in this way, like her, we will be able to bring the light of his love to everyone.”

On **Tuesday, 3rd February**, the Feast of St Blaise, the Blessing of Throats will be celebrated at the **10.00am Mass**.
