## **Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Our readings this Sunday invite us to consider God's laws and true wisdom.

In the First Reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus (which means the book of the Church), Jesus Ben Sirach underlines how God has given us loving guidelines, but it is entirely up to us as to how we respond. God has also given us the gift of free will. The Psalmist praises God's law: we will experience happiness as we seek God and follow in his ways.

In the Second Reading, St Paul points out that true wisdom comes from God. Only the Spirit of God can reach the depths of all things.

St Matthew, in the Gospel, describes the relationship between the Law of Moses and the more radical vision of Jesus. Jesus has not come to abolish the Law but to complete it.

## **Ash Wednesday**

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of **Lent**, the 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving leading up to Easter.

In the Bible, ashes are a traditional sign of sorrow for sin. People in the Old Testament would put on sackcloth and ashes as a visible expression of repentance. When we receive ashes, we are publicly acknowledging, "I am a sinner. I need God's mercy."

When ashes are placed on the forehead, we hear either "**Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.**" (Gen 3:19) or "**Repent, and believe in the Gospel.**" (Mk 1:15). This isn't meant to depress us; it is meant to put life in perspective. When we contemplate that we are dust and that life on earth is temporary, we are reminded that what truly matters is our relationship with God.

Ashes are placed in the shape of a cross on the forehead, to be seen, because:

- our faith is not meant to be hidden
- we belong to Christ
- the Cross is the sign of salvation.

Ash Wednesday is not just about sin or death - it is about hope, and a call to renewed hope. The ashes we receive are made from the burned palm branches from the previous year's Palm Sunday. This connects Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem with His suffering and Resurrection. Ashes mark the beginning of a spiritual journey from repentance, calling to mind that we are mortal, to the joy of resurrection in the light of Easter.

### Ash Wednesday and the Forty Hours Adoration

The Season of **Lent** begins on Wednesday of this week, 18<sup>th</sup> February. Masses will be at 10.00am and 6.15pm and ashes will be blessed and distributed during Mass. **Ash Wednesday** is a day of Fast and Abstinence. It is not a Holy Day of Obligation.

As is usual at Mount Argus, the **Forty Hours Adoration** will begin on **Ash Wednesday**. Adoration will begin after the 10.00am Mass and will continue throughout the day, ending with Prayer and Benediction from 7.30pm to 8.00pm. On **Thursday, 19<sup>th</sup> February**, the Adoration will again resume after the 10.00am Mass and continue until Prayer and Benediction from 7.30pm to 8.00pm. Do try to join us (in person or online) for this evening time of meditative Prayer and Benediction on 18<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> February, as a way of beginning Lent in a reflective spirit.

During the Forty Hours, there will be the usual evening Mass at 6.15pm.

To ensure that there is always someone praying before the Blessed Sacrament during the Forty Hours Adoration, a **chart** has been placed at the back of the Church this weekend. You are invited to sign up for a half hour of prayer during the Forty Hours Adoration.

### Suggested Lenten Exercises

- Mass during the week (10am and 6:15pm)
- Praying the Rosary (after 10am Mass daily)
- Adoration (Exposition on Thursdays and Fridays 4 – 6pm)
- Stations of the Cross (after 10am Mass on Fridays)
- *Lectio Divina*\*
- Spiritual Reading (The Practice of the Presence of God)\*\*
